State Center City Council Regular Meeting Minutes January 17, 2023

Mayor Pfantz opened the meeting at 6:30 p.m. Present were Mayor Pfantz, Councilors Darrow, Grant, Nichols, Shaffer and Quick. Absent: None. Also present were T. Hillers, K. Yates (taking minutes in the clerk's absence), J. Thomas, Z. Faught, C. Davis, Kohle Nieland of CGA, Brad Pfantz, Andy Blink & family, & Linda Wells.

- Motion by Darrow, 2nd by Nichols to approve the consent agenda including transfer Res. 23-36 totaling \$26,244.43. The clerk report, Utility Reconciliation and Public Works reports were not presented. Motion passes 5-0 roll call.
- Mayor Pfantz administered the oath of office to Thomas Hillers, City Attorney.
- As Jeff Robinson was absent there was not an electric update.
- Zach Faught reported the well repairs are complete and we are back on city water.
- There was nothing to report on brush dump site.
- Motion by Shaffer, 2nd by Grant approving the 2023 sealcoat quote from Manatt's in amount of \$40,630.00. Motion passes 5-0.
- Quick moved to adopt Res. 23-38 approving a 50 cent/hour raise for E. Thompson upon successful completion of his position 6-month probation on Feb. 1 along with awarding him 3 personal days and 2 vacation days per the employee handbook. Grant 2nd, Res. 23-28 is adopted 5-0 roll call.
- Mayor Pfantz administered the Fire Department Lieutenant oath to Andy Blink and Fire Chief Pfantz awarded the Lieutenant pin.
- Shaffar updated council on a meeting with Chief Pfantz and Studio Melee on progress of fire station design plans.
- Shaffar moved to adopt Res. 23-37 setting a public hearing to hear comments for and against the proposed FY23 max levy rate increase of .51% for certain non-voted levies for February 21st, 6:30 p.m. This maximum percent would increase revenue from these levies by \$2,722.00. This does not include the debt service levy which is not included in the max levy calculation. Nichols 2nd, Res. 23-37 is adopted 5-0 roll call.
- K Nieland presented a plat believed to be the plat for the planned annexation of land for the proposed fire station. *See note below.
- Motion by Darrow, 2nd by Shaffar to excuse \$1,772.85 in sanitary sewer charges at 315 3rd ST NW, owned by Spire Management. A water line had frozen and broken. Motion passes 5-0.
- The only audit proposal received was from Bowman & Miller. The proposal is for audit service for FY 23, 24 & 25 at costs of \$ 17,000, \$17,850, and \$18,750 respectively. Motion by Shaffar, 2nd by Darrow approving accepting the audit services proposal. Motion passes 5-0.
- Mayor Pfantz reviewed goals the council had set in January 2022 and offered to council his thoughts on goals for 2023.
- There being no other business, motion by Shaffar, 2nd by Grant to adjourn at 7:01 p.m. Motion passes 5-0.
